## What to bring:

**Warm** sleeping bag, blanket, pillow, PJ's, toiletries, towel, a couple of changes of clothes, 2 pairs shoes, heavy jackets, swimsuit, Bible, notebook, pencil, rain gear, bug repellent, flashlight, camera, hat. In general: evenings may be cold and days may be hot....It's Northern Michigan!

## Arrivals and Departures

For Parent/Child Weekends:

- \* **Friday:** Please – no arrivals before 8 PM. Program and snack begin at 10 PM
- \* **Sunday:** The weekend concludes around noon. Please let us know if you need to leave early.



## DIRECTIONS TO CAMP:

### Easiest route from the Detroit Metro area, Flint or Bay City

- ◆ Take I-75 north
- ◆ Exit at Standish. As you pass through Standish, move to the right lane because it becomes US-23. (You are an hour from Camp)
- ◆ Take US-23 through the town of Omer, until the junction of M-65 (at a traffic signal).
- ◆ Turn left (north) onto M-65. You will travel through Twining and Whittemore.
- ◆ The last town before camp is Hale (you are 15-20 minutes from Camp).
- ◆ Continue north on M-65 for 11 miles. Watch for the AuSable River Camp on the left – a small cluster of red cottages.
- ◆ Watch for the green road sign on the right for the “River Road Scenic Byway” and Oscoda.
- ◆ Turn right on River Road. If you cross the AuSable River, you’ve gone too far!
- ◆ Cross Monument Road, passing the Lumberman’s Monument Visitors Center.
- ◆ After passing Cooke Dam Rd., camp is just under a mile away! At night: Watch For Reflectors Mounted On The Sign.
- ◆ Turn left onto a dirt road at the camp sign. Turn right 100 yards in at crossroads. (Don’t go straight!)
- ◆ Welcome to camp!!!

The Camp road is 1 1/4 miles long. It is a one lane, sandy road owned by the US Forest Service. We’re blessed to own property surrounded by forest! Be cautious and courteous as you drive. Keep an eye open for wide spots for pulling over, allowing others to pass. Watch for deer and wild turkeys! Come to the center of camp to the parking lot. Registration is in the Dining Hall. Come on up!

## Travel Highlights:

- \* River Rd. is designated a Scenic Byway because of its beauty. We recommend a visit to Lumberman’s Monument or Largo Springs.
- \* The ice cream store in Hale has been a great stop for years! Watch for the huge cone sign on the west side of the road. A great treat for the trip home!
